Toastmasters members elect Theo Black to international Board*New Director at 250,000-member organization is from Wayzata, Minnesota*

RANCHO SANTA MARGARITA, Calif., Sept. 9, 2009 – Theo Black of Wayzata, Minn., has been elected to the Board of Directors of [Toastmasters International](http://www.toastmasters.org), the world's leading organization devoted to teaching skills in communication and leadership. Black was elected to the two-year term at the organization's 78th annual International Convention, held last month in Mashantucket, Conn.

Black, an information technology project manager, joined Toastmasters 10 years ago to improve his presentation skills. He is now a member of four different Toastmasters clubs and has earned Distinguished Toastmaster status – the highest speaking designation a member can achieve. He has also served in Toastmasters leadership positions, including district governor.
